This agreement to remain in affect for five years or until cancelled in writing. It neither compels you nor guarantees your eligibility for participation.

1. You are responsible for knowing the rules. *(No one told me or I didn't know will not pass as an excuse.)*
2. Fire - Propane fires are allowed only in approved areas. No wood, charcoal or white gas fires are allowed in the Park. Fire Extinguishers – At least a current, certified 2-A:10-B:C or better per encampment or booth is required
3. Black Powder – only with a permit from the Festival & subject to the guidelines of the KGA (www.kgaguilds.com)
4. Smoking – Participants are *not* to smoke in public view while in costume. Smoking will be permitted in the designated smoking area only.
5. Drugs– A zero drug tolerance policy is in effect.
6. Alcohol – Anyone found with a can or bottle of alcohol will be removed from the event. Crossroads holds the liquor license and pays the liquor liability insurance. Drunkenness or unruly behavior will result in immediate expulsion from the event.
7. All weapons are to be sheathed and secured at all times, except during event *approved* "gigs". Any person found brandishing a weapon will be subject to immediate expulsion from the event. Bullwhips are a weapon.
8. Crafts or any other item from a Guild member or other participant may be sold *only* through consignment at the gift shop or from an approved vendor booth. Sales tax will be charged.
9. Vehicles – only one vehicle from each guild or booth allowed on the site. Keep speed at **5mph** or less at all times in the Park. Remember there are people and small children on the site. Do not play car stereo at your site. Not everyone wants to hear your music. Park only in designated participant parking.
10. Handicapped parking – Use only the participant handicapped parking places. Do not park in the Guest handicapped parking places.
11. Trash – If you bring it with you, take it out with you, especially during setup. We have trash bags if you need them. There is no trash service. Household trash service will be provided during the Event. All trash must be in a sealed plastic bag and placed by the edge of your encampment/booth by 10 minutes after close of event or you must remove it yourself.
12. Who may participate – You must be on a participant list and in an appropriate costume. Only booth owners/managers may put workers on their list. Guild members must comply with the KGA requirements. (www.kgaguilds.com)
13. Camping – you must have a valid camping pass to stay on the site 1 hour after closing. Camping is permitted from noon Friday to noon Monday. Quiet time is **11:00pm**. Have courtesy for others after hours.
14. ID Badges – You must have an ID badge to access the participant gate. Adult guardians must accompany minors. Any participant caught sneaking into or letting others into the Event site or camping without a valid ID badge and/or camping pass will be permanently removed from the Event.

15. Participants may purchase day passes for family members and other special guests at approximately 38% off, these are available during morning presale hours at the food court or as posted. Registered participants may buy tickets for ½ off 30 days prior to the event. If you need admission for a VIP, please contact the office. Valid Koroneburg photo ID required at all times to purchase tickets
16. Participant gate – All participants will access the site through a participant gate. Participants and their coolers, backpacks, etc cannot be brought through the Guest gates. All vehicles persons and carried on items are subject to search.
17. Kids – Minor children must be kept with their guardian, guild members or booth personnel. Participants are responsible for the conduct of their children
18. Cleaning – Please help to keep the site clean. Pickup and dispose of trash in proper receptacles. Clean up after yourself in the restrooms.
19. Water & Electricity - **Water is not potable, do not drink it. Do not hook-up to any electricity without permission from Crossroads Management.**
20. Building – Your guild or booth owner must have an approved plan before any building, permanent or temporary can take place.
21. Power Augers – None are allowed as there are high voltage lines running through the site
22. Tools – Crossroads does not have tools or supplies to loan.
23. Planting – See *Guild Space Guidelines* or *Booth Space Guidelines* for additional information. (at the office)
24. Hazardous materials – no hazardous materials may be used or stored. If you are not sure, **ask!**
25. Pets – you must have a permit issued by the event for all pets and have proof of valid liability insurance.
26. Gate Greeters – Guild members will participate in gate greeters as per the KGA agreement. (This agreement was signed by your guild on your behalf.)
27. Theme – You must reflect the theme of the event in which you are participating.
28. Closed days - The Park is often closed for private events during the year. Please call ahead or you may be turned away.
29. Etiquette - Do not touch the personal property of others without their permission. When performances are in progress do not join in without being asked. Do not interrupt a performance unless it is a real emergency. Do not distract guests who are attending another's performance. Parades, etc. see *Guild Agreement*. (www.kgaguilds.com)
30. Participants consent to the use of their names, pictures, images, recorded voice or music by the Festival without inspection for such purposes as commercials or promotional usage.
31. Participants agree to comply with Federal, State, County and local ordinances and/or regulations.
32. Hold Harmless – All participants agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless, the US Army Corp of Engineers, Riverside County, Riverside County Parks and Open Spaces District, Crossroads Riverview Park, Inc., Crossroads Productions, The Crossroads Group and their officers, boards, employees, volunteers, independent contractors, elected and appointed officials and agents for any liability and any damages, whatsoever, including, but not limited to, property damage, personal injury or death, arising out of or in any manner connected with the use of Premises, with or without the event's permission. (Crossroads Riverview Park, Inc. is on land leased from the County of Riverside Parks & Open Spaces District & the US Army Corps of Engineers.)
